Dr. Hyde was Freeport, Maine's first physician and practiced in town for sixty five years, 1792-1857.

Three of the volumes have a separate index. Volumes record patient name, dates of visits or services, charges, payments, and occasionally the town of residence. Notations rarely itemize treatments and medicines prescribed. Born in Massachusetts, Dr. Hyde studied medicine with a Boston, MA physician. He came to Freeport in 1792 and opened a practice which he maintained until his death in 1857. A son, E.A. Hyde and a grandson, Nathan D. Hyde, also became physicians, with E.A. practicing in Freeport. A few entries in the ledgers are listed for patients in neighboring towns. There are also some loose receipts for medicines he purchased.

Co., used by Freeport House to record registration of guests, most of whom were from elsewhere in Maine and Massachusetts; many of these may have been associated with Freeport's shoe industry. Proprietors were Fred E. Ward and later, F. R. Libby. Occasionally the entire hotel was taken over by a traveling theater company or concert group. Several Maine high school baseball teams also stayed at the hotel. Alternate pages contain composite advertisements for Freeport businesses. At the end is the American Hotel Guide.

Many items were typed separately and attached into the book, not always in chronological order. Corporation started by Edmund B. Mallet, Jr. and Willis H. Soule of Freeport and others of Portland, ME. In 1930 Consumers Water Co. purchased Freeport Water Company; thus this record book covers the entire span of the company's existence.

Original letters and papers of Pratt Family. Many of the materials are addressed to Fred Pratt and his wife Matilda (Tillie) who resided throughout the period in Freeport. Fred owned a business dealing in Lime, Hair and Cement. They had 6 children who left Freeport from time to time and lived in Vermont, Massachusetts and Connecticut. The collection includes numerous long letters from their son Percy, who is best known for writing weekly news poems to the Freeport troops during World War II. He also made his own bricks to build his house. Their son Osborne was a farmer in Vermont. Their daughter Clara graduated from Gorham Normal School in 1914, did graduate work at Harvard, and taught at Perkins School For the Deaf in Watertown, Massachusetts. They had two other daughters, Ethel {Ethyl) and Laura.

Their son Everett was a boat builder and repairman. He married Florence Hazel Lavers, a young woman from Massachusetts who summered on Bustin's Island. The majority of the correspondence is addressed to Everett and Hazel and to their daughter Dorothy Hazel Pratt.
